Individuals are assigned life skill trainers and case managers to help prioritize goals. All medical, dental, counseling, and other appointments are kept, as well as medication stored and provided per doctor's orders. Provides students with neuroeducational assessments, counseling for themselves and their families, and job training/placement assistance. Classes meet for four hours a day, Monday through Thursday, and are staffed by credentialed special education instructors and are assisted by neuropsychologist, instructional associates, aides, interns and volunteers.
