PubMed for VetMed featuring MyNCBI

This is a basic course in PubMed with a focus on Veterinary medicine. In this class you will be shown how to perform a basic veterinary search in PubMed. You will also be shown how to effectively use PubMed's MyNCBI. MyNCBI is a tool designed to save and update searches as well as a customization tool for PubMed.
