National Library Week Highlight: University Archives

This fall, Western University of Health Sciences will be opening four new colleges: Biomedical Sciences, Dental Medicine, Optometry, and Podiatric Medicine. At this time of growth, take a look back and reflect on how it all began by visiting the University Archives and Historical Museum.

The University Archives serves as the official memory of the University. The Archives identifies, preserves, and makes available the documentation of continuing significant and historical value of the University: its academics, administrative concerns, and student life. The University Archives works with university records creators and holders to identify and acquire key records in a variety of formats, both physical and digital.

Included are:

- Records of campus offices, including academic, administrative, library and research offices
- Records of student organizations
- Minutes of meetings
- Personal papers of faculty and founding fathers
- Materials documenting the achievements of University officers, staff, faculty, students, alumni, and benefactors
- Publications produced on campus, such as the WesternU View, Neocortex yearbook, directories, reports, surveys, and newsletters
- Photographs, negatives, slides, films, audiotapes, and videotapes of campus events
- Theses and dissertations completed by University graduates
- Maps, drawings, blueprints and other architectural drawings
- University memorabilia
