What inspired you to pursue your health sciences career path? When deciding what I wanted to do as a career while still in high school, my English teacher prompted me with two questions: who do you want to help and how often do you want to do it? These words were lifechanging as I knew immediately I have always wanted to help anyone I could every day I could do it. That led me to a health profession and looking into the dental field stole my heart.

What is the biggest challenge you overcame on your path to WesternU? When I graduated from UC Irvine in 2021, I tried looking for any position in a dental office and it was quite difficult. I was able to shadow two offices, but offices were not hiring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This caused a dent in my first round applying to dental schools because I had few hours by the time applications were due in the fall. Understandingly, I did not get into any schools my first time applying.

Why did you choose to attend WesternU? When searching for dental schools, I researched and attended any information sessions offered. WesternU was one of the only schools to offer various links and zoom presentations with vast information. I could not apply to WesternU the time first around because I had not started working at any dental office causing lack of a dentist letter. However, this school was always on my mind and continued sending emails with information, the choice was so clear the second time applying.

What is your proudest accomplishment? Getting into college in the first place and graduating with a Bachelor of Science degree as a first generation Latina woman given my background was at the top of my greatest accomplishments. However, up to this point in my life, nothing has beat the feeling I got when Dr. Tabrizi called me and let me know I got into dental school. The amount of emotion I felt and continue to feel is like no other.
