Program Description

This Western University Residency Program is a PGY1 Pharmacy Practice Residency in a Geriatrics setting. The resident will primarily rotate at Los Angeles Jewish Health, which is a 239-bed skilled nursing facility with a 10-bed Joint Commission accredited geriatric psychiatric inpatient unit. Even though it is a skilled-nursing setting, the facility is licensed as a hospital pharmacy. To highlight, the resident will be involved in the vast clinical programs offered at the facility, including new admission medication reviews, post-fall assessments and anti-microbial stewardship programs. The resident will also have an opportunity to be involved with acute-care rounds in a team of inter-disciplinary providers at the inpatient psychiatric unit. Additionally, the resident will be extensively involved in our short-term rehabilitation center conducting transition of care medication reconciliation program in an interdisciplinary team of providers. Moreover, there are many opportunities for the resident to be involved in teaching as an APPE preceptor and providing lectures at WesternU. This PGY1 residency program will provide accelerated services that will progress beyond an entry-level professional competency in patient-centered care and in pharmacy operational services. The resident has two experiential opportunities off campus in Internal Medicine (in-patient) and an elective of resident's choosing. In addition, development of leadership skills will be emphasized throughout the residency experience with involvement in the local association(s) of choice. The PGY1 residents will develop and master problem-solving skills and decision-making skills under the guidance of a model practitioner. The training will enhance the resident's clinical judgments, professional values, and sense of responsibilities toward the pharmacy profession. To assess these skills and values, the following competencies must be met: managing and improving the medication-use process; providing evidence-based patient-centered medication therapy management with the interdisciplinary team; exercising leadership and practice management; demonstrating project management skills; providing medication and practice-related education/training; and utilizing medical informatics.
