For the next two years at WesternU, I am committed to volunteering and demonstrating community commitment to improve the health and well-being of our medically underserved neighbors.

After graduation, I plan to serve in the military or U.S. Public Health Service Commissioned Corps and pursue a career in health care to further assist people in underrepresented areas. What is your proudest accomplishment? At El Camino College, I initiated a Policy and Advocacy Meeting to propose the Shower Access Bill (AB 1995), which allows any student enrolled in a California community college to shower in the facility's locker rooms. I attended the Student Senate for California Community General Assembly to advocate for and present this bill which led to it being passed in both houses and signed by Governor Brown in 2015.

What inspired you to pursue your health sciences career path? PAs are responsible for treating patients of all ages, which while incredibly rewarding, can undoubtedly be a stressful position. With flexibility in choosing specialties, I find that I can combat stress and burnout associated with work in health care while cultivating my passion for medicine.

Why did you choose to attend WesternU? I decided to come to WesternU because of the interprofessional education (IPE) among nine distinct health professional programs that will foster the value of collaborative patient-centered care as a PA graduate. The location was another drawing point because it is close enough to home.
